# State of Iowa CDBG Program

- » **Last Years Allocation = \$21.6 million**
- » **National Objective**
  - Benefit to low- and moderate-income persons (70% of allocation or greater)
  - Slum & blight elimination
  - Urgent need
- » **Eligible Applicants**
  - All cities under 50,000 population (including Cedar Falls)
  - All Counties
  - City or County on behalf of non-profit entity

# **PROCUREMENT**

# CDBG Procurement

- » **CDBG recipients must comply with new requirements in 2 CFR 200**
- » **Consultants/ COGs may not be involved with procurement of services if they plan to bid on those services. (applicable to all service providers)**
- » **Cities will need to sign off on a form stating these requirements were followed (Will be uploaded into [lowagrants.gov](http://lowagrants.gov) with application)**

# General Procurement Requirements

- » **Efficiently and Economically Procure for services/materials**
- » **Competition - Full, Open and Free** (statutory – CFR language)
  - **Primary Methods:**
- » **1. Direct Solicitation** (also includes other finite audiences – plan rooms, grantee web page, posting at local public locations such as city hall, post office, etc.)
  - For competitive proposals , sealed bids for construction, materials.
- » **2. Publicize in Official Publication** (regulatory – satisfies “full, open and free competition” statutory requirement and typically mirrors a cities’ more formal procurement standards)
  - Utilize publication(s) typically used for grantees general business publication notices (provide sufficient time frames and always document this process)
  - Must clearly explain the scope of work, criteria, submittal time frame(s) and/or bid documents that sources will be evaluated on

# Professional Services Evaluations:

## » **Qualification Based Selection methods:**

- **RFQ** for A/E – price not necessary
- **RFP** for Admin and other professional services (unique environmental or archeological services, appraisers, construction managers) – price quotes should be included as one of the evaluation factors.

## » **Sample Evaluation factors for RFQ and RFP**

(not all-inclusive, generally evenly weighted for scoring)

- Experience and technical competence of firm and individuals
  - Creativity and problem solving abilities, design skills
- Capacity and capability of firm and individuals
  - Technical project cost controls, construction observance, time scheduling
- Past record of performance
  - References, customer satisfaction
- Proximity to and familiarity of the project area
- Price quote(s) as appropriate for RFP's (no percentage of cost or cost-plus contracts)

# 2017 Water and Sewer Fund

- » **Last Year set-aside: over \$7 million**
- » **Fund Ceilings**
  - 0-999 population - \$300,000 (max of \$1,000 per person)
  - 1,000-2,499 - \$500,000
  - 2,500-14,999 - \$600,000
  - 15,000-49,999 - \$800,000
- » **Eligible Activities**
  - Water and wastewater treatment facilities
    - Expansion, rehabilitation, new construction
  - Water and wastewater collection systems
    - Rehabilitation, new construction
  - Water storage
  - Wells
  - Stormwater/sanitary sewer separation



# 2017 Water and Sewer Fund

## 2017 Application Cycle

- » **September 27, 2016**                      **Application Workshop**
- » **Applications submitted in IowaGrants by 11:59 PM**
  - **January 1, 2017 -- tentative award by March 1st**
  - **April 1, 2017 -- tentative award by June 1st**
  - **July 1, 2017 -- tentative award by September 1<sup>st</sup>**
  - **October 1, 2017 -- with tentative award by December 1<sup>st</sup>**
- » **Week of June 19, 2017**                      **Recipient Workshop (tentative date)**

# 2017 Applications

- » **Water & Sewer application requirements for 2017:**
  - If project needs DNR permit:
    - Sewer – Approved Facility Plan letter submitted
    - Water – Approved Preliminary Engineering Plan letter submitted
  - Local match committed & documented:
    - If DNR SRF - project must be on the approved Environmental Protection Commission IUP
    - If USDA-RD - USDA letter of conditions must be submitted
- » **If not submitted with the application, the project will not be funded**

# 2017 Applications

- » **More competitive applications will also have (but not required):**
  - Environmental review complete
  - Final engineering complete or at least underway (if awarded, CDBG would then only reimburse construction activities)

# **WATER AND SEWER FUND – KEY POINTS**

# W/S – Key Points

- » **Need for the Project**
  - Health or safety concerns (DNR violation) or is project just an amenity
- » **Timely Start and Completion**
  - A/E procured, realistic construction start date and overall timetable to complete project
- » **Local Funds Leveraged**
  - % of project leveraged with other, and/or city funds
- » **Cost Per Beneficiary**
  - < \$5000 CDBG dollars / beneficiary
- » **Best Long Term Option**
  - A/E and/or DNR recommendations
- » **Affordability - Existing Water & Sewer Rates / Bonding Capacity**
  - Most efficient use of leveraged funds
- » **Readiness to proceed**
  - Preliminary / final design complete, matching funds secured, capacity of recipient

# Readiness Requirements

- » **Procurement of engineer prior to submittal of application**
- » **Other funding agencies commitments**
  - On EPC IUP
  - USDA Letter of Conditions
- » **Approved Preliminary Engineering Report letter**
- » **Approved Facility Plan letter**
- » **Environmental review complete**
- » **Final design completed or underway**

# 2017 Scoring Criteria

- » **Slight modifications made in 2016 to water and sewer application scoring**
- » **8 scoring criteria**
- » **Criteria scored on a 1 to 5 scale. Maximum of 40 points**
- » **Criteria regarding LMI benefit added.**

- » **Magnitude of need for the project**
- » **Degree to which project can be completed in a timely manner**
- » **Degree to which CDBG funds will be leveraged by other funds**
- » **Cost per beneficiary**
- » **Degree of impact project will have on identified need & quality of life**
- » **Readiness to proceed**
- » **Capacity to operate and maintain proposed project**
- » **LMI benefit**

- » **Last Year set-aside: \$1.5 million**
- » **Fund Ceilings**
  - 0-999 population - \$300,000 (max of \$1,000 per person)
  - 1,000-2,499 - \$500,000
  - 2,500-14,999 - \$600,000
  - 15,000-49,999 - \$800,000
- » **Eligible Activities**
  - Child Care Centers
  - Facilities for Physically and Mentally Challenged
  - Senior Centers
  - Homeless Shelters
  - Stormwater & Drainage

- » **Week of May 15, 2017**      **Awards (tentative date)**
- » **Week of June 19, 2017**      **Recipient Workshop (tentative date)**

# 2017 Applications

- » **Community Facilities & Services application requirements for 2017:**
  - Site Control demonstrated by either:
    - An option on the parcel secured with money (if necessary) or
    - Ownership - as long as it is purchased prior to the application submittal date
- » **If not submitted with the application, the project will not be funded**

# 2017 Applications

- » **More competitive applications will also have (but not required):**
  - Pre-application meeting with IEDA to discuss high performance construction consistent with Iowa Green Streets Criteria
  - Environmental review complete
  - Final architectural plans completed or at least underway (CDBG would pay for only construction)
  - Local match committed & documented

# 2017 Applications

- » **Stormwater C/F Fund** - more competitive applications will have:
  - Pre-application meeting with IEDA to discuss project scope and green infrastructure approaches to project
  - Environmental review complete
  - Final Engineering Complete or at least underway (CDBG would pay for only construction)
  - Working with DNR or IDALS on a sustainability stormwater project

# CF&S – Key Points

- » **Need for the Project**
- » **Timely Start and Completion**
  - Realistic construction start date and overall timetable to complete project
- » **Local Funds Leveraged**
  - % of project leveraged with other, and/or city funds
- » **Cost Per Beneficiary**
  - < \$10,000 CDBG dollars / beneficiary
- » **Capacity to Operate Facility**

# CF&S – Key Points

- » **Amount of Local Funds Committed or Secured**
- » **Readiness to proceed**
  - Procurement of Architect
- » **Will Meet National Objective After Completion**
  - Certain projects may need to survey; Form 3-D
- » **Worked with IEDA to have a project design consultation early in process and before application is submitted**
  - Assistance is available at no cost

# Readiness Requirements

- » **Pre-application meeting with IEDA to discuss high performance construction consistent with Iowa Green Streets Criteria**
- » **Environmental review complete**
- » **Final architectural plans completed or at least underway**
- » **Local match committed & documented**

# Scoring Criteria

- » **Slight modifications made in 2016 to Community Facility application scoring**
- » **9 scoring criteria**
- » **Criteria scored on a 1 to 5 scale. Maximum of 45 points**
- » **Criteria regarding LMI benefit added.**

# Community Facilities & Services Scoring Criteria

- » **Magnitude of need for the project**
- » **Degree to which project can be completed in a timely manner**
- » **Degree to which CDBG funds will be leveraged by other funds**
- » **Cost per beneficiary**
- » **Degree of impact project will have on identified need & quality of life**
- » **Readiness to proceed**
- » **Capacity to operate and maintain proposed project**
- » **LMI benefit**
- » **Meets or exceeds building/design criteria (Green Streets)**

# Stormwater Management

## » **Defined area – community-wide or targeted area**

- Drainage map and analysis of stormwater benefits
- Targeted area project cannot provide community-wide benefit

## » **Project justification**

- Analysis of alternatives – bioswales, detention and infiltration
- Cost effectiveness
- Plan / capacity for maintenance

## » **Technical Assistance Resources**

- All projects must work with Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (IDALS) Urban Conservation Team for project design guidance from earliest stages of design
- IDALS team will review designs at 30, 60, and 90% complete along with final designs. This is a contract condition now in all stormwater contracts. ***Follow new process checklist similar to SRF sponsored project checklist.***
- Design consultation service is available at no cost as well during application development. Please contact Jeff Geerts, [jeff.geerts@iowa.gov](mailto:jeff.geerts@iowa.gov) and use this assistance.

# Water/Sewer and CF&S Program Requirements

- » **Low- and Moderate Income Survey**
- » **Community Development and Housing Needs Assessment**
- » **Minority Impact Statement**
- » **Federal Assurance Signature Page**
- » **Applicant/Recipient Disclosure/Update Form**
- » **Public Hearing Documentation**
  - Notice, Signed Minutes and Proof of Publication or Affidavit of Posting
- » **Resolution Committing Funds**
- » **Documentation of other funding sources**
- » **Target Area Map**
- » **Incomplete applications will NOT be reviewed.**

# Water/Sewer Program Requirements

## » **Water/Sewer Fund**

- Procurement of engineering services documented, if seeking reimbursement
- Cost estimates
- DNR inspection reports or correspondence
- Copy of current rate ordinance for W/S utilities

## » **All water & sewer applications must have procured for engineering services prior to CDBG application**

- If not, applications will be considered incomplete
- Procurement of final design also recommended prior to application (SRF design funds)






# IowaGrants.gov - Tips

- » **When entering text, watch for the maximum character count.**
- » **Responses should be concise, but fully address the question.**

## Project Site/Location Narrative

Attach map that identifies selected/eligible sites and their relation to downtown. For projects focusing on rehabilitating specific eligible building facilities including interior improvements, also attach a floor plan. If using the slum and blight national objective, map must visually delineate the slum and blight area, as well as the target area for project if different than slum and blight area, and also which properties are proposed for improvements. See instructions on Slum & Blight inventory forms for more specifics on how to document and submit information on each property.

Describe location of proposed improvements in the context of the downtown area. How was the specific site(s) been determined for the project? Describe any unique characteristics of the project area.

(1,500 character max.)

- » **If an application is incomplete it will NOT be reviewed. Complete means all required documents are uploaded and include all necessary information. IEDA will not give applicants an opportunity to “fix” applications or supplement information as has been done in years past.**
- » **Water & Sewer applications will be accepted on a quarterly basis starting January 2017.**
- » **Project planning should begin now! Facility Plan or Preliminary Engineering Report will be required with application!**
